The PCPB announces that the next regular meeting on 19 February applications will continue to be accepted for those interested in running for one of the 5 vacant seats that will be available at the upcoming March 19th Election. The election will be held at the Point Loma Library on Voltaire from 4 PM to 8 PM. Applicants must obtain a majority vote meaning they must have over 50% of the electorate vote. To be eligible to run one must be 18 years of age, be a Peninsula Property owner or a Peninsula resident.

In addition there will be a Forum on March 5th where the citizens of Point Loma can ask questions of the candidate and become more acquainted with those running for the vacancies.

The PCPB is an advisory board to the City Planning Department whose primary purpose is to advise the City Council, Planning Commission and other governmental agencies as may be appropriate in the initial preparation, adoption of, implementation of or amendment to the Peninsula Community Plan and Local Coastal Programs as it pertains to the area or areas of concern to the PCPB. Some of these concerns are addressed through the following active committees: Project Review, Traffic and Transportation, Airport Advisory, Environmental/Water, Parks and Recreation, Signage, Arts and Cultural/Historic preservation and occasional Ad Hoc committees formed for pertinent issues. This is a great opportunity for citizens of Point Loma to contribute in a very meaningful way to their community.

Stay tuned for the publication of the names of the candidates following the February 19th Meeting. The regular meeting is at the Point Loma Library on Voltaire and starts at 6:30 PM.
