RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PARKING TIME LIMIT AND
PARKING METER ZONES

This petition requests the City to conduct a study to determine whether the installation or removal of time limit or metered parking is appropriate for the location. If determined to be appropriate, the request for a parking meter zone will be brought to the City Council for final decision. If a parking study determines that a parking time limit zone is appropriate, the request will be brought to the Department Head or his/her designee for final approval.

Both types of requests are sent to the respective community planning group and community parking district (if one exists) for input prior to City Council action or City Manager approval.

Property ownerships may be obtained from the County Assessor's office located in the County Administration Building, 1600 Pacific Highway.

The average time for processing the request is 60 days.

We moved to the Kellogg Beach area in Point Loma four years ago and noticed there are two hour street signs posted for parking from 8-2 pm Monday thru Friday. These signs were originally installed 30 years ago to prevent

the military from the sub base from parking in the neighborhood. That issue no longer exists. The people who park there are beach people. It is a public beach. And most of the people who park there are residents who are tax paying citizens who only want to be able to live at the beach and not be subject to parking restrictions. Could you please take a close look at this parking sign issue. The residents of this beach community would be grateful.
What goes up can eventually in time, 30 years, come down. Thank you for your consideration in the handling of this matter. We appreciate whatever you can do to remove these parking signs.
