

PCPB TTSC Meeting Minutes

District 2 City Council Rep. Conrad Wear was in attendance and briefed the Committee on numerous items.

The Committee had a wide ranging discussion with Mr. Wear about our traffic and transportation concerns and the process to remedy unsafe conditions.

Discussed were MADs- Maintenance Assessment Districts which provide enhanced services to the district. The Liberty Station MAD is in the Peninsula Community Planning area.

Mr. Wear also informed the Committee about process and that funds were available for community use in our desire to add and remedy dangerous traffic conditions and intersections in the Peninsula. One source for these funds are PFFPs. Public Facilities Financing Plans, which are there to implement the community plan in identifying public facilities infrastructure, in which transportation facilities are included. Several Community transportation and facilities projects have been funded in the past with PFFPs. We could use PFFPs to assist our TTSC efforts to remedy our 5 Dangerous Intersections and other traffic situations that the community has identified as problematic, or dangerous.

Conrad encouraged the TTSC to move forward and identify additional streets and intersections that were of community safety concerns.

Conrad stated that the street light for the end of Marquette Place was being evaluated. There were some technical issues involved with implementing the request.

Other items discussed were: Identifying which Capital Improvement Projects to prioritize, panhandling from traffic medians, using the Get It Done App to address maintenance issues in the Community. Conrad recommended the Community to use

Conrad also noted that there are free trees available through the City's Urban Forestry Program.

The Action Items:

3a. Letter to City-Linda Marabian/Lori Zapf- Five Dangerous Streets and Intersections. The TTSC unanimously voted 4-0 to approve forwarding the draft letter to the PCPB for consideration as an Action Item at the January PCPB meeting.

3b. and 3c. were tabled for consideration at a future meeting.
